Ashmansworth	SU413580	25-Aug-04	Det. TCGR Sep 2004 (from detailed measurements plus one corolla specimen). Two at SU4138 5801 and two at SU4138 5803 with 30 introgressed <i>G. amarella</i> & <i>G. x pamplinii</i> , but gone from the former site at SU407575. (see also <i>Watsonia</i> 25, p.356).
Litchfield	SU46315528	28-Aug-20	Verge on east edge of A34 by Seven Barrows. Many dozens of flowering plants.
Litchfield, beside A34	SU463552	23-Jul-00	Hundreds of plants, still in tight bud, extending from SU4631 5532 to SU4631 5524.
Litchfield, beside A34	SU463553	24-Aug-11	Many hundreds of plants, beginning to come into flower, from SU46316 55345 to SU46310 55239, with somewhat fewer <i>G. amarella</i> . [In fact many of the plants here are known to be the hybrid <i>G. x pamplinii</i> - ARGM]
Litchfield, beside A34	SU463553	23-Jul-00	Hundreds of plants, still in tight bud, extending from SU4631 5532 to SU4631 5524.
Seven Barrows, by A34	SU463553	21-Aug-99	Specimen V.2001.017.019 in NMW. Both biennial & annual plants present in good numbers (1,000s). <i>G. amarella</i> and hybrids also present.
Litchfield, beside A34	SU463553	21-Aug-99	c.10,000 plants (c.5,000 are <i>G. germanica</i>) - very diverse population, much evidence of introgression.

I have omitted some earlier records, or duplicates, with the same grid reference.
