Basingstoke Canal, North Warnborough	SU7351	01-Jan-97	Recorded in 15 1km squares. The most common Potamogeton on parts of the canal, often locally dominant in shallower water but absent in the centre channel. Increasing in the Coxmoor area but apparently decreased in Odiham and North Warnborough areas (though possibly under-recorded due to weed cutting). Now rare or absent in some stretches, notably Fleet. [CRH could find none on the canal during his 2009 survey].

The most common Potamogeton on parts of the canal, often locally dominant in shallower water but absent in the centre channel. Now rare or absent in some stretches, notably Fleet. [CRH could find none on the canal during his 2009 survey].

Increasing in the Coxmoor area but apparently decreased in Odiham and North Warnborough areas (though possibly under-recorded due to weed cutting). Now rare or absent in some stretches, notably Fleet. [CRH could find none on the canal during his 2009 survey].

Now rare or absent in some stretches, notably Fleet. [CRH could find none on the canal during his 2009 survey].

Basingstoke Canal, Eelmoor	SU8452	01-Jan-97	Recorded in 15 1km squares. The most common Potamogeton on parts of the canal, often locally dominant in shallower water but absent in the centre channel. Increasing in the Coxmoor area but apparently decreased in Odiham and North Warnborough areas (though possibly under-recorded due to weed cutting). Now rare or absent in some stretches, notably Fleet. [CRH could find none on the canal during his 2009 survey].
